Appendix L -Launceston College

The College uniform is a comfortable, practical and easy care alternative to the more formal uniform worn in many colleges. It is worn by all students in Years 7 to 11 when representing the College on their way to and from College, throughout the College day and at important events.

At Launceston College we believe that a smart and tidy appearance is very important for all of our students, particularly in preparing them for the expectations of future employers and the world of work. We would like all our students and parents to appreciate the part that uniform plays in contributing to the ethos and learning environment of the College.

Our uniform promotes a strong, cohesive, College identity that supports high standards and a sense of identity among students: it seeks to support integration, equality and cohesion amongst students.

We expect all College students to take pride in their appearance and to remember that they are ambassadors for their College.

First impressions are important; ensure your uniform is always correct, clean, tidy and worn with pride.

The College uniform is:

Plain white polo shirt with collar

When worn the collar must be visible. Shirts must at least be long enough to meet the top of the trousers. Any t-shirt or vest worn underneath the polo shirt must not be visible.

Plain black tailored trousers of a traditional design

Not skinny trousers, jeans, chinos or trousers with pockets on the legs. Trousers should be full length and meet the top of the shoe (socks should not be visible if the right length). If a belt is worn it must be black.

Plain black tailored knee length pleated skirt of a traditional design (girls)

Skirts should not be of jersey stretch material. Skirts should be knee or near-knee length. (available from Hazard)

College navy blue sweatshirt or jumper

With College logo.

Plain black or grey socks

Plain black polishable school shoes

Shoes must be wholly black, with no white or coloured markings and any laces must be black. Trainers, boots, skate shoes, shoes designed for leisure wear, suede or canvas shoes or shoes with prominent logos are not

permitted. See images as a clear guide – none look like or could be considered as trainers or leisurewear. Shoes should be kept clean and smart.



Please pay particular note to the style of shoe, trouser and skirt that are part of College uniform as some shops sell items in school uniform sections that are not permissible at this College.

Please make sure that every item of clothing is clearly marked with your name.

All students

Outdoor wear

Coats, gloves and scarves may only be worn outside College buildings. We encourage students in inclement weather to wear coats that are practical in design – warm and weather proof. Warm woollen or fleece hats may be worn outside. Fashion scarves should not be worn.

Jewellery

Excessive jewellery must not be worn but some jewellery is allowed and students may wear no more than a single stud earring in each ear, a fine necklace worn underneath the polo shirt and a wristwatch. No finger rings,

face piercing or other jewellery is allowed. Belts should fit in belt loops and be black.

Where students are entitled to wear additional uniform items such as Sports Leaders or Ten Tors polo shirts, the uniform must be that supplied and worn only by those students entitled to wear it. It is still expected that students wear College jumpers.

Other advice:

Hair

Should be a natural colour and worn in a style that does not compromise health or safety. Hair styles, including Mohican and other non-gradual changes in length, patterned shaving, and grade 1 or below, are examples of unacceptable hair design. Hair ornaments should be no larger than a 50p piece. If there is any question over the nature of extreme the Principal will decide.

Make up

Should be discreet; if it is noticeable it is not discreet.

School bags

Should be suitable, preferably a backpack or messenger bag that is big enough to hold an A4 folder.

Chewing gum

Is not allowed.

Drinking water

Is allowed in lessons in clear plastic bottles but is not allowed in science laboratories or areas where IT equipment is in use. Students are responsible for topping up drinking bottles at break and lunchtime and not during lesson times. No other drinks are allowed in class.

College Equipment:

The following items should be brought to College each day in a backpack or messenger bag that is big enough to hold an A4 folder:

- The relevant exercise books, texts books or PE kit for your lessons on that day
- A reading book (KS3)
- A calculator
- A pencil case containing:
 - a black pen
 - a pencil
 - an eraser
 - a 15cm ruler
 - a pencil sharpener

a protractor
a pair of compasses

Appendix B – Bideford College

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

Bideford College Uniform is a positive expression of our ethos and values. The wearing of our uniform encourages students to treat each other and the College environment with respect. It supports students in learning how to dress appropriately. It contributes to our pastoral system with each student wearing their House tie achieving a sense of community and belonging. It sets an appropriate tone, supporting positive behaviour and discipline and high expectations for all.

UNIFORM DESCRIPTION

Students are expected to wear the full College Uniform whenever students are on site at Bideford College. This includes the journey to and from school and on visits as required. This applies to all students Years 7 – 11.

Blazers/Jackets must be worn to and from school, unless students are advised during hot weather that it is a 'Shirt-sleeve order Day.'

Blazers/Jackets should be worn at all times around the school; with a common sense approach being taken to wearing blazers/jackets in the classroom. It is essential that all items of uniform are named on the inside label.

Girls

Black jacket/blazer with Bideford College logo

A formal plain white shirt/long sleeved/short sleeved – with collar and top button. These must be long enough to be tucked in at all times.

A tie – which will have different colour stripes depending upon the house.

Black tailored trousers/shorts or black straight/pleated skirt (no stretchy material). Skirts must be knee length. (NB; Shorts are only allowed to be worn in the summer term)

V neck black jumper to be worn under the jacket/blazer **(optional)**

Shoes must be plain black, with a flat heel. Any laces must be black. Trainers, boots (including ankle boots), canvas shoes, open-toed, pumps, sling-backs are **not** acceptable.

Socks/tights – plain, neutral, grey or black socks – to be worn with trousers/shorts or skirts. Alternatively, plain black or flesh coloured tights may be worn with the skirt.

Boys

Black jacket/blazer with Bideford College logo

A formal plain white shirt/long sleeved/ short sleeved – with top button. These must be long enough to be tucked in at all times.

A tie – which will have different colour stripes

Black tailored trousers/shorts (NB; shorts are only allowed to be worn in the summer term)

V neck black jumper to be worn under the jacket/blazer **(optional)**

Shoes must be plain black, with a flat heel. Any laces must be black. Trainers, boots (including ankle boots), canvas shoes, open-toed, pumps are **not** acceptable.

Socks – plain, neutral, grey or black socks – to be worn with trousers/shorts

HOW YOU CAN PURCHASE THE UNIFORM

Skirts/Trousers and Shorts

These can be purchased from any supplier. However, items NOT purchased from In-Stitches must be **indistinguishable** from the standard school skirts/trousers and shorts, which we recommend you purchase from In-Stitches.

Blazer/Jacket/Tie/Jumper* (*optional purchase)

These can **ONLY** be purchased from In-Stitches. The jumper itself is optional, but if you choose to wear one – it must be purchased from In-Stitches. In order to enable you to try on the blazers/jackets for appropriate sizing please contact reception. From September 2016 uniform can be ordered from student reception.

Students attending College in incorrect uniform will **NOT** be permitted to attend lessons. Parents will be contacted immediately and asked to supply the appropriate school uniform.

COST AND METHOD OF PAYMENT

The College have worked extremely hard to ensure that the cost of the uniform is comparable with neighbouring secondary schools and is of good quality and durable.

Skirts/trousers and shorts can be bought from any supplier. However, items NOT purchased from In-Stitches must be **indistinguishable** from the standard school skirts/trousers and shorts, which we recommend you purchase from In-Stitches.

From September 2016 methods of payment will be cash, cheque or online payment.

For those students eligible for financial support, help and advice will be available from the Head of House.

APPROVED SUPPLIERS

The blazer/jacket/tie/jumper* (*optional) can ONLY be purchased from our local supplier In-Stitches – via the College.

We also recommend you buy the trousers/shorts and skirts from In-stitches to ensure that these meet the College expectations and to avoid an item of uniform not meeting requirements. However, these items can also be purchased from alternate suppliers, should you wish to do so.

APPEARANCE

Jewellery

A watch is permitted. No rings, bracelets or necklaces are allowed. For pierced ears small studs or sleepers (gold or silver in colour); a maximum of one in each ear lobe. Studs in noses or any other part of the face are not allowed.

Hair

Extreme styles are not condoned by the College. Hair must be of natural colour. If the hair is over shoulder length then it should be tied back for all practical lessons or where health and safety requires it. Shaving of any part of the head is not accepted, nor is the use of gel to create unusual styles.

Make up

Coloured nail varnish is not permitted in school. Gel or acrylic nails or shellac polish are also not permitted. Light make up may be worn to give a natural look. Excessive make up will be removed.

Medical

At times students have medical conditions which make it difficult to comply with College uniform requirements. We request that parents/carers discuss this with us prior to a student breaking College rules as it avoids embarrassment and upset all round.

Religious or Cultural Differences

The College welcomes and celebrates diversity, and therefore, if any of the above requirements cut across recognised religious or cultural mode of dress, we would be happy to discuss this with parents/carers.

Parents/Carers are asked to support the College by adhering to our uniform policy.

PE KIT

PE kit can be brought at Reception or at several shops in the Bideford or Barnstaple area. All PE kit must be marked with a name to enable lost kit to be returned to the owner. All jewellery must be removed for PE lessons and long hair must be tied back.

Please note, the current PE kit will be changing for September 2017.

Boys

Red rugby shirt with a reversible white/black band.

Plain red t-shirt for indoor and summer use.

Long plain red socks

Football boots

Trainers with non-marking soles

Girls

Plain red polo shirt

Black shorts (not cycling shorts)

Black tracksuit bottoms (optional winter only)

Long plain red socks (short red socks acceptable in the summer)

Trainers with non-marking soles

Other

Shin pads and gum shield

A black Bideford College hoody, with the college logo, is available for sale from reception for PE lessons only. Alternatively the 2015/16 college sweatshirts may also be worn in PE.

For astro turf lessons all trainers and Astros acceptable. No blades or studs, moulds only.

Appendix E – Egloskerry Primary School

Our school uniform is:

- a red sweatshirt, jumper, fleece or cardigan
- white shirt or polo shirt
- black or grey trousers, shorts or skirts
- red and white checked dresses in warm weather
- safe, comfortable shoes – black – not trainers
- plain red, grey or black tights, plain white or black socks
- plain red sun caps or Egloskerry school sun caps

For PE your child will need:

- A pair of black shorts, and/or black jogging bottoms, and/or black leggings
- An 'Egloskerry logo' T-shirt, or a plain white/red T-shirt (no football shirts)
- A pair of plimsolls and/or trainers (no studded football boots)
- All in a small named bag



For Forest Schools or outdoor learning your child will need:

- Old clothes with long sleeves and legs covered, long hair tied back, waterproofs when necessary, outdoor shoes/boots or wellies
- Children will not always need these in school - we will let you know in the newsletter and/or notes from teachers



All clothing and belongings need to be named so we can easily return anything that is lost.

We ask that children do not wear jewellery to school, or wear nail varnish. For health and safety reasons, long hair should be kept out of children's eyes and tied back, particularly for PE and Forest School sessions. Extreme hairstyles such as sculptured names or symbols, or dyed hair, are neither appropriate nor acceptable for children of primary school age.

A selection of uniform, reading book bags, PE bags and other clothing items are available to purchase in school and orders are made during the year. Please contact the school office (secretary@egloskerry.net, 01566 785 372).

Appendix A – Atlantic Academy

Ready to Learn Expectations and Guidance

All students should be ready to learn. They will show this by:

- Being smartly dressed in the correct uniform
- Being on time to school and lessons
- Having the correct equipment and resources for each lesson

Uniform

The uniform at Atlantic Academy is a symbol of our students' engagement in their learning, respect for our learning community and aspiration to achievement their very best. It is worn by all students in Years 7 to 11 and we expect all Academy students to take pride in their appearance and to remember that they are ambassadors for their Academy, on their way to and from the Academy, as well as throughout the day. The uniform reflects a pride and commitment to being a member of Atlantic Academy and is a visible sign of their readiness to learn. First impressions count so make sure your uniform is always correct, clean, tidy and worn with pride.

The Academy uniform is:

- **Atlantic Academy Blazer** - worn at all times when moving about the site, in assembly and in lessons
- **White shirt** with collar and sleeves it must button up to the collar and is of sufficient length to stay tucked in
- **Atlantic Academy tie** worn smartly (with five stripes showing) and tied up to the collar of the shirt
- **Optional plain navy V-neck jumper or plain navy waistcoat**
- **Formal pressed, plain navy trousers** (must not be skinny fit) or **formal navy knee length skirt or smart tailored knee length navy shorts**. Navy or black plain belts are allowed.
- **Plain black shoes or trainers** with a low heel and laces should be **all black**. Sports trainers can be worn at break times but students must change footwear for lessons.
- **Plain navy, black or neutral tights socks**, NO leggings or thermal wear to be visible under shorts or skirts.
- **Waterproof outdoor coat** big enough to wear over the blazer, hats, scarves and gloves can be worn to and from the Academy and during break times but must then be stored in lockers during lesson times.
- Hoodies are not permitted at the Academy; if worn to school, they must be stored in lockers during the day.

Every item of clothing must be clearly marked with the student's name. If for any reason students are not in the correct uniform they must report to reception as soon as they arrive at school.

PE Kit

- Academy Tracksuit bottoms or shorts
- Academy Polo shirt or Rugby top
- Trainers

- Optional kit includes Academy fleece, thermals/under armour and waterproofs (weather dependent).
- Football studs, shin pads and other specialist equipment can be brought in when appropriate for lessons (these can be borrowed instead of bought). Suncream and a cap should be worn when working outside in sunny weather.
- Long hair must be tied back (boys and girls) and all jewellery must be removed.

Jewellery, Make Up and Hair

- Excessive jewellery must not be worn but some jewellery is allowed and students may wear - no more than a single stud earring in each ear, a fine necklace worn underneath the school shirt, a wristwatch and single small ring. These will all need to be removed for practical lessons at the teacher's request. Clear nose studs are permitted, but must be removed for all practical lessons.

No additional rings, visible facial piercings or other piercings/jewellery items are allowed.

- Jewellery worn for religious reasons needs to not interfere with learning and may need to be covered up if it is unable to be removed.
- Hair must be a natural colour and worn in a style that does not compromise health or safety. Extreme hair styles are not appropriate for the Academy. (If any question over the nature of extreme the Principal will decide).
- Make Up should be discreet; if it is noticeable it is not discreet! This includes fake tan that is not of a natural colour. Fake nails and coloured nail polish are not allowed.

Students will be asked to remove make up or jewellery that isn't discrete before they attend lessons. Jewellery will be confiscated if dangerous and returned to a parent.

Equipment

- School bags should be practical, large enough to carry the necessary books, equipment and easy to carry. A rucksack style is ideal.
- Student pencil cases needs to include:
 - At least two pens (black/blue)
 - At least two pencils
 - A ruler
 - A rubber
 - Whiteboard pens
 - A calculator
 - Optional items include - protractor, compass, glue, scissors, scientific calculator
- Phones are allowed in the Academy however students are not allowed to use them in sessions without the express permission of the teacher for a specific activity. Phones will not be able to be connected to the school wifi.
- Chromebooks will remain in the Academy and be available when needed for lessons during the school day.

- If students bring in their own IT devices, parents and students take responsibility for them. Only devices registered with the IT team will be able to connect to the academy wifi.
- Additional items may be needed for specific subjects (e.g. Food technology, STEM) so students will need to be well organised to bring them to school for the correct sessions.
- Chewing gum is not allowed.
- Drinking water is allowed in lessons in clear plastic bottles but is not allowed in science laboratories or areas where IT equipment is in use. Students are responsible for topping up drinking bottles at break and lunchtime and not during lesson times. No other drinks are allowed in class.

Arriving at a lesson without the correct equipment disrupts the learning of others so students will need to buy missing equipment at reception at the start of the school day.
